School Expansion

This investment will provide existing students with the enhanced facilities they deserve and enable even more students to attend The County High School Leftwich and be provided with joyous and rewarding experiences and opportunities to achieve excellence. Following feedback from students regarding the Year 9 & 10 boys' toilets, we are making some alterations to the facilities. There are also a number of gender-neutral accessible toilets in the building. We hope students are reassured that we continue to listen to their views on a number of matters and, wherever possible, act to improve the student experience for all.

COVID Control Measures

1. Ensure good hygiene for everyone

- a. Continue to encourage washing of hands with soap and water
- b. Hand sanitiser continues to be available at various points in the building
- c. Tissues continue to be available and should be disposed of in bins

2. Maintain appropriate cleaning regimes

a. regularly touched surfaces will be cleaned more often

3. Keep occupied spaces well ventilated

- a. windows and doors are kept open wherever possible
- 4. Follow public health advice on testing, self-isolation and managing confirmed cases of COVID (see below)

Students must not attend school if they:

- 1. have any of the symptoms of COVID
- 2. have received a positive LFD test result for COVID
- 3. have received a positive PCR test result for COVID

Self-isolation period for individuals who test positive for COVID-19

You can do a rapid lateral flow test from day 5 of your self-isolation period (but not before) and another test the next day. You can stop self-isolating if:

- both tests are negative
- you do not have a high temperature

You should stop testing after you've had 2 negative test results in a row. Anyone who is unable to take LFD tests will need to complete the full 10-day period of self-isolation.

Daily testing for close contacts of COVID-19

Adults who are fully vaccinated and all children and young people aged between 5 and 18 years and 6 months identified as a contact of someone with COVID-19 are strongly advised to take a LFD test every day for 7 days and continue to attend their setting as normal, unless they have a positive test result.

Confirmatory PCR tests

Staff and Students should follow the latest government guidance on confirmatory PCR tests in <u>Stay</u>
 at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) 12 infection
 following a positive LFD test

Asymptomatic testing

- Testing remains important in reducing the risk of transmission of infection within schools.
- Staff and students should continue to test twice weekly at home, with lateral flow device (LFD) test kits, 3-4 days apart
- Testing remains voluntary

Face Coverings

- Face coverings are no longer advised for students, staff and visitors in communal areas.
- Staff and students should follow wider advice on face coverings outside of school, including on transport to and from school.
