After a busy four weeks since the half-term break and as we look forward to the festive period, I wanted to update you on a number of areas.

#### **COVID Measures**

Due to consistently low numbers of students and professionals reporting positive COVID cases, from Monday (29<sup>th</sup> November) students, professionals and visitors will not be required to wear a face covering in the building. This is following communications with the Cheshire West and Chester public health team. Should students, professionals and/or visitors wish to continue to wear a mask in the building they are welcome to do so.

As the weather gets colder we would like to remind students of the importance of wearing a base layer, under their uniform. We will continue to keep the windows open, wherever possible, balancing the need for increased ventilation with maintaining a comfortable temperature. We will continue to keep all measures under review.

#### **Christmas Events**

We are busy planning for a number of Christmas events, which, providing COVID case numbers remain low, we are delighted to be able to hold in-person, in the most part, albeit with restrictions in place.

In particular, as <u>shared via a letter</u> earlier this week, on Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> December at 18:00 we will be holding a Carol Service at St Wilfrid's Church, Davenham. I am extremely grateful to Reverend Iveson who is welcoming us into the Church. I know this will be a fantastic curtain raiser to the festive season.

Friday 10<sup>th</sup> December is our Christmas Music Concert in the school hall, starting at 19:00. This event will be another opportunity for our musicians to share their talents. The event will be at reduced capacity. Details of how to obtain tickets have been shared with the musicians' families in the first instance and will be shared more widely should there be capacity to do so.

Both the Carol Service and the Christmas Concert will stay under review regarding the restrictions on them and whether or not they go ahead in person. We very much hope they both will.



The Senior Citizens' Christmas Event this year will involve our Year 11 students delivering gifts to local Senior Citizens. Thank you to all those families who have donated gifts and well done to Year 11 for organising this.

There will also be lots of opportunities for students, along with their form tutors to contribute to the festivities in school by taking part in activities, including decorating their form rooms. I look forward to seeing the creative and imaginative decorations as they bring a little sparkle to our classrooms and corridors.

Christmas lunch will be on sale in the Canteen on Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> December.



# **Student Tracking and Interventions**

Congratulations to students in Year 9, 10 and 11 for the mature and dedicated attitude they brought to their Student Tracking exams. Students displayed a commitment to their studies and I'm sure many will be delighted with the results when they receive them in the coming weeks. The most important outcome of the Student Tracking exams is for us to find out what students know and more importantly



what they don't know. We will then design and implement bespoke interventions to get the students to where they need to be. I'm sure Year 7 and 8 students will be equally as focussed on their Student Tracking tests in the coming weeks.

Year 11 will have a mock results event on 6<sup>th</sup> December, where they will receive their projected grades. Full Year 9 and 11 reports will be published prior to Christmas. Year 7, 8 and 10 students' reports will be published following the break.

Congratulations to those students who are embracing the after-school tutoring from across Year 7-11. Very impressive prioritisation of their studies. Thank you to the colleagues who are delivering this.

## Parent/Carer Survey

Thank you to those Year 7, 8, 10 and 11 parents/carers who responded to the parent/carer survey. Initial analysis of the 157 responses so far shows:

- 99% of parents/carers would recommend the school to another parent
- 94% strongly agree or agree that their child is happy in school (96% when including neutral responses)
- 98% strongly agree or agree that their child is safe in school (99% when including neutral responses)
- 85% strongly agree or agree that the school makes its pupils behave (94% when including neutral)
- 88% strongly agree or agree that their child does well at this school (99% when including neutral)

Parents/carers in Year 9 will be forwarded the survey following their Information Evening on the 15<sup>th</sup> March 2022. We will use the responses to help make the school even better.

Congratulations to the 164 students across Year 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11, who were awarded their Achieving Excellence Bronze badge at the start of November. I was delighted to see so many students embracing the joyous and rewarding experiences my colleagues have been providing and will continue to provide.

## **COVID Control Measures**

## 1. Ensure good hygiene for everyone

- a. Continue to encourage washing of hands with soap and water
- b. Hand sanitiser continues to be available at various points in the building
- c. Tissues continue to be available and should be disposed of in bins

## 2. Maintain appropriate cleaning regimes

- a. regularly touched surfaces will be cleaned more often
- 3. Keep occupied spaces well ventilated
  - a. windows and doors are kept open wherever possible
- 4. Follow public health advice on testing, self-isolation and managing confirmed cases of COVID (see below)

## Students must not attend school if they:

- have any of the symptoms of COVID, in which case they should book a PCR test <u>https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test</u>
- 2. have received a **positive LFD test result for COVID,** in which case they should book a PCR test and continue to isolate until the PCR result is received
- 3. have received a positive PCR test result for COVID
- 4. are required to **quarantine** <u>https://www.gov.uk/guidance/red-amber-and-green-list-rules-for-entering-england</u>
- 5. have been told to **isolate** by NHS Test and Trace

**Close contacts** of COVID positive cases no longer need to isolate as long as they:

- are fully vaccinated
- are under 18 and 6 months
- have taken part in or are currently taking part of an approved COVID vaccine trial
- are not able to get vaccinated for medical reasons

Close contacts will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace and advised to get a PCR test and/or isolate. Unless told to isolate they are able to continue to come to school whilst they wait for the result.



**Household Contacts** - if one individual in a household tests positive, any children and young people in that household who attend school or college should:

- Take a PCR test (ideally on Day 3-5 after first exposure), and
- Take a daily LFD test for 10 consecutive days from the date of first exposure
- Continue to attend school provided that their test results (PCR and LFD) are negative
- Self-isolate for 10 full days from the date of the test if any of their test results are positive
- In the event of a **positive LFD** test result, obtain a confirmatory **PCR test**
- If the confirmatory PCR test is taken within the two days following the positive LFD result and PCR result is negative, the young person can return to school/college.
- In the case of other contacts (identified by NHS Test and Trace), we will continue to advise on any additional testing measures on a case-by-case basis.

  - The Dingle Centre, Winsford
  - Pop up mobile testing unit
  - Libraries: Northwich, Neston, Frodsham and Ellesmere Port and the mobile library service

# Asymptomatic COVID Testing

- For students/staff where consent has been granted, continue to test twice weekly in the home, following the initial two on-site tests
- Where consent has been granted, students under 12 should be tested by an adult, in the home
- Results (positives and negatives) should be uploaded to <u>https://www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result</u>
- If a student or member of staff has a positive test with the home testing kits, a PCR test should be booked via <a href="https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test">https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test</a> . They should not attend school



### **Face Coverings**

- Students, professionals and visitors are welcome to wear a face covering.
- The government expects and recommends people continue wearing a face covering on public transport.
