Wednesday 18 th May	Language Component 1: Fiction Reading & Creative Writing (1 hour 45 minutes) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Section A (Reading Fiction): You will answer 5 questions on one extract from a novel – the extract will be no longer than 2 sides of A4. • Section B (Creative Writing): You will write your own short story after choosing one of 4 titles provided (it is recommended that you use a pre-prepared story which you adapt to the title chosen).

Wednesday 25 th May	Literature: Romeo & Juliet and Blood Brothers (2 hours) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Romeo & Juliet: You will answer an extract question based on a scene from the play (20 minutes), and an essay question (40 minutes) on a character, theme or relationship. • Blood Brothers: You will answer one Source-Based Question which will be focused on a character, theme or relationship from the play – responses should cover plot, characters, themes, style, and use quotes. 			
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Date	EXAM THREE: Literature			
Wednesday 8 th June	Literature: A Christmas Carol and Unseen Poetry (2 hours) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A Christmas Carol: You will answer one Source-Based Question which will be focused on a character, theme or relationship from the novella – responses should cover plot, characters, themes, style, context and use quotes. • Unseen Poetry: You will be asked one question with two parts: Part A and Part B (it is likely to appear as two numbered questions). You will be expected to explore one poem in Part A then compare two poems in Part B. 			
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Date	EXAM FOUR: Language			
Friday 10 th June	Language Component 2: Non-Fiction Reading and Transactional Writing (2 hours) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Section A (Reading Non-Fiction): You will answer six questions based on two extracts of non-fiction writing: one will be from the 19th Century and the other will be from the 21st Century. • Section B (Transactional Writing): You will be asked to write an article and a formal letter, and should follow the conventions of both of those text types. 			
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
