2 mark question – 'State'. You will need to recall one of the topics key concept words *e.g. state what is meant* by the term stewardship

- 5 mark question 'Describe'. You will need to describe key beliefs, practices or viewpoints from one or two religions. E.g. Describe religious beliefs about the sanctity of life
- 8 mark question 'Explain'. You will need to explain, from two different religions or two different religious ٠ viewpoints (two different views from the same religion e.g. Sunni Muslims and Shi'a Muslims or Catholic Christians and Protestant Christians) their beliefs on a topic e.g. 'Explain from two religious traditions or religions, their attitudes towards women leading worship'. Your answer should follow the PEEI (point, explain, evidence, impact) structure.
- 15 mark question 'Discuss'. You will need to discuss (provide more than one point of view) on a statement that you are presented. E.g. 'All religious people should disagree with the death penalty'. In your response to these questions, you should follow the SONIC structure and you will need to;
 - Ensure that you present more than one point of view
 - Refer to religion and belief in your answer
 - Refer to non-religious views, such as those held by atheists and Humanists in 2D (Life and Death 15 mark question)
 - Reach a justified conclusion of the strongest argument presented 0
