D&T	Google Classroom D&T classes will continue from last year.	Students will continue to rotate through 3 areas of D&T this year, to ensure they maximise their skills development in D&T, prior to Starting GCSE in year 10. In the spring term they will work in their second material area. Their Google classroom will remain the same. Food- Students will study Food from different Countries and Cultures. They will complete several practical lessons including making and shaping a pasta dough, Bolognese, macaroni cheese, bread rolls and a Victoria sandwich cake. CAD/CAM - Isometric drawing, Techsoft 2D design skills, manipulating designs, cutting materials on both the laser cutter and fret saws designing their own mobile phone holder. Textiles – Students will be introduced to safe working in the textiles room. They will then design of a cushion cover for a coffee bar with a music influence.
