If **you don't do something about people being late, then more people start to do it and it becomes normal, which is not good. Usually, people decide if to be on time or not.**"

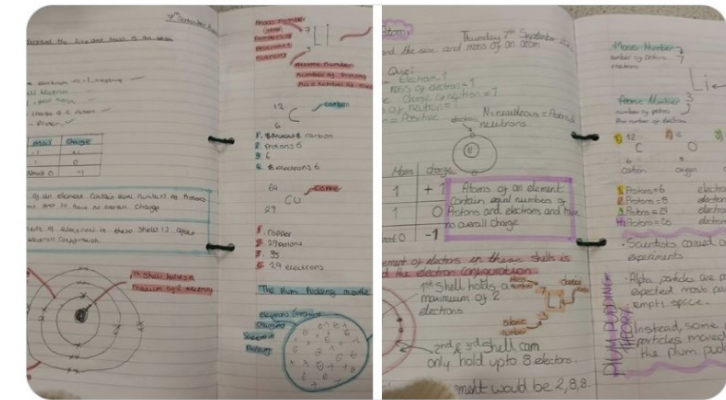
