Dear Parent or Carer

The HPV vaccine is available to boys and girls in school year 8

The Human Papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine that protects against HPV-related cancers is available to all year 8 boys and girls. It is also available to year 9, 10 and 11 boys and girls who missed this when they were in year 8.

By having this vaccination, your child will be protected against the most common cause of cervical cancer, some mouth and throat cancers, and some cancers of the anus and genital areas for many years to come.

Please read the PDF leaflet sent with this letter for information about the HPV vaccination. The e-consent link for the HPV vaccination is below.

It is important that you complete a consent form online before the deadline, otherwise your child will not be called for their vaccination.

Measles

Now is a good time to check if your child has had 2 doses of the MMR (Measles, Mumps and Rubella) vaccine.

Measles is an infection that spreads very easily and can cause serious problems if it spreads to other parts of the body, such as the lungs or brain. Having the MMR vaccine is the best way to prevent it, and your child needs to have received 2 doses in order to be protected.

Measles symptoms include: high fever; sore, red, watery eyes; coughing; aching and feeling generally unwell; a blotchy red brown rash, which usually appears after the initial symptoms.

The number of young people catching measles has risen. It's never too late to be vaccinated. You need two doses of MMR one month apart to be fully protected against measles, mumps and rubella.

It's time to make measles a disease of the past.

If you have symptoms of measles, stay at home and phone your GP or NHS 111 for advice. **STAY AWAY** from GP surgeries and A&E departments – you could spread the illness to others.
