College guidance – What to do when you receive your GCSE results

Sir John Deane's College

1. GCSE Results Day

Step one of enrolment involves you securing your place at Sir John Deane's College.

On GCSE results day, Thursday 21st August, you must email your GCSE results to the college no later than 1.00pm. This should be an official document with your name and have the school's name or logo clearly visible e.g. a PDF, a scan or a clear photograph of your results slip taken on your phone. If we don't receive your results by this time, your place at the college will be at risk.

You will receive an email on Tuesday 19th August with clear instructions and an email address to submit your results.

2. Your Enrolment Appointment

Step two of enrolment will take place after GCSE results day. We enrol over a three-day period so that all families have the time and space to comfortably consider options. You will be given a face-to-face enrolment appointment on one of the following days:

· Tuesday 26th August / Wednesday 27th August / Thursday 28th August

You must be available to come into college on one of these dates to enrol in person. If you are unable to attend enrolment in person, for example, because you are away on holiday, you must let us know by emailing admissions@sjd.ac.uk

Parents are actively encouraged to attend enrolment, as we recognise they play a vital role in the success of students. During your enrolment appointment, you will meet with teachers to discuss your subject choices and confirm a programme of study that will set you up for academic success.

Three very important things you need for enrolment are:

- £65 contribution fee which covers your two years at Sir John Deane's (payable by cash or card)
- · Proof of identity (preferably your passport, alternatively your birth certificate)
- · If you received access arrangements at your previous school or have additional learning needs, please bring evidence that supports this to enrolment. You will have the opportunity to discuss your support needs.

Reaseheath College

On 21st July candidates will receive a letter and email with their enrolment appointment date and time, this will be on campus.

What will happen during your enrolment appointment:

- 1. Your Course Manager will check your results and confirm your place.
- 2. You'll receive your induction timetable for the first week and find out whether your first day will be 3rd or 4th September.
- 3. We'll take your photo for your college ID card, so it'll be ready for your first day as a student.

4. Please do make every effort to attend your allocated enrolment date and time slot.

What should I bring to enrolment?

- If you fall into the category of holding pre-settled or settled status, or are 19 or over, a form of ID is required to complete enrolment (e.g. passport or photo-ID)
- Your GCSE or other qualification results
- Reminder We are a cashless campus and only accept card payments

Cheshire College South & West

- All applicants will receive an email with their enrolment appointment, please contact the college if you haven't received this before results day. Applicants must attend their appointment to confirm their place at the college
- If a student doesn't meet the entry requirements of the course/college still attend the appointment as the college's careers team will be able to discuss all options available

Warrington & Vale Royal College

On GCSE Results Day, applicants are required to upload their GCSE results digitally before attending their enrolment appointment. To assist with this, we've created a short FAQs page and video guide, available at: wvr.ac.uk/joiningus

Enrolment at Warrington & Vale Royal College is in person. If an applicant cannot make it for any reason, they MUST let our Admissions Team know as soon as possible, who will then advise them what to do. They will likely need someone to enrol for them on their behalf.

All applicants with offers will be invited in on Thursday 21st August and Friday 22nd August, but enrolment will continue in the w/c 25th August for 'walk-ins' who would like to enrol on courses with remaining places but have not yet applied.
